BOYCE HISTORICAL TIDBITS

Actions by the first Town Council

3/1/1920 Charles H Smith was elected assistant Town Sergent and assistant Chief of Police and duly sworn in by Mr. Reed, acting Mayor.

The Committee Lights instructed to move one of the lights on Page Boulevard nearer the Turnpike. (Where was Page Boulevard??)

The Mayor was instructed to request Mr. Lee and Mr. and Mrs WB Stuart to remove the unsightly debris on their respective lots resulting from the burning of their buildings thereon.

5/3/1920 Curfew discussed — but present ordinance as to disorderly conduct (pg 45) considered sufficient—
for emergency

Report of the Elections: It is hereby certified that the number of electors at this election amount to 18 eighteen—and we further certify that no ballots were not counted because void—Attest.

J.T. Sprint received 13 votes for Mayor, Wm M Gaunt had 3, and M.L.P. Reed and JT Sprint had 1.



Town of Boyce Spring Cleanup, Monday, May 6, 2024

As we prepare for the upcoming Spring Cleanup event on May 6th, it's important to ensure that we adhere to specific guidelines to facilitate a smooth and effective process.

Please see the guidelines below:

Items Placement: All items for disposal must be placed curbside. This location ensures easy access for collection teams and efficient removal of items.

Packaging:

Please ensure that items are tied in bundles or securely bagged. This helps prevent loose items from scattering and facilitates safe handling during collection.

Size and Weight Restrictions:

Each item should weigh less than 50 pounds and be under 4 feet in length. Items exceeding these limits may pose safety hazards during collection and may not be accepted.

Prohibited Items:

Certain items cannot be accepted during the clean-up.

These include chemicals, TVs (<u>without previous payment to the town—see below</u>), batteries, tires, or any other items not accepted at the landfill.

Limitation on Staff Access:

Our staff is unable to enter private properties to pick up items.

Please ensure that all items for disposal are placed within the public right of ways or accessible areas.

We appreciate your cooperation in adhering to these rules, as they help ensure the safety of our staff and the efficiency of the clean-up process. By working together and following these guidelines, we can make your community cleaner and more enjoyable for everyone.

Disposal fees for the following items which are collected by the landfill will be passed on to the residents.

\$22.50 for TV's \$30.00 for TV's with wooden consoles \$15.00 for computer monitors \$ 5.00 for UPS (uninterrupted power supply)

ALL ELECTRONIC ITEMS LISTED ABOVE MUST HAVE A STICKER PROMINANTLY DISPLAYED. Stickers may be purchased from the Town Hall by calling (540) 837-2901 or email boyceva@verizon.net. Exact change or checks made out to the Town of Boyce will be accepted.

<u>Items not acceptable: Yard waste, hazardous waste (oil, gas, chemicals), tires, lawn equipment</u>
